"Baby Cyclone," Fast-Moving Comedy, Is Enacted Cleverly by Cast Chosen By Director Saxon of Transylvania

Revealing the one way to get along with the woman you love was dramatically demonstrated when the Stars of Transylvania College most ably presented their hilarious comedy, "Baby Cyclone," under the direction of Prof. Edward Saxon at the Henry Clay auditorium last night. The experimental Thanksgiving show was mutually successful. The show moved rapidly through numerous scenes which illustrated the genius of the author, George M. Cohan, who put perhaps his least work in this engagement of a mother, a daughter and a young married woman, all infatuated with a feline dog. Naturally the two husbands and the fiancee object, and thus developed the plot. Radiating a lovable personality even though she portrayed a disgusting character, Miss Ann Elizabeth Jones won the hearts of the audience for hysterical blubbering scenes drawn sympathetically yet acrimoniously. When reconciliation was finally effected, it was easy for the audience to do as her husband—forgive and forget.

The charming fiancée, Miss Chrystal Thompson, charmed the audience with her poise and loveliness as she fittingly portrayed her character. Her indignation at her lover because of his refusal to permit her to have a dog was unusually impressive. Both she and Miss Jones were extremely amusing when in business and dressing gowns in the last scene.

Albert W. Farmer bore the burden of those which he gave smoothly and impressively. The fact that his fiancée should choose the dog in preference to him enabled him to demonstrate his ability as an actor. In choosing Mr. Farmer for this character the director showed he is mostly proud after the performance last night.

Tommy through a role most suitable for him, James K. Riley furnished comedy and life to the play. When his wife began her baby talk with the dog, his temper was uncontrollable and we at one time even feared for the safety of Miss Jones, as natural was the outburst.

Equally important were the roles carried by Winston Stubbs and William Stubbs, and both were handled with expertise and precision. The former revealed the way to handle women and masterfully enacted his role as the father. A New York cop, William Stubbs, forcefully displayed his ability.

In the minor roles, Charles Trumbo, as a butler, was outstanding for his comedy. Mattilda McClannahan, as the mother, showed remarkable ability and added a splendid character to the last act. Misses
