The Faculty have good reasons to entertain the hope, that before the commencement of another session, satisfactory arrangements will be made with the city council, for the admission of the pupils of the University to the advantages of the Louisville Marine Hospital; and that, in the course of the season, a comfortable and commodious edifice will be erected, convenient to the hospital, for the purposes of Clinical Lectures, Surgical operations, and Autopsic examinations.

The Anatomical Rooms, lighted with gas, are open from 7 to 10 o'clock, P. M. every working day except Saturday, when those who desire it may dissect in the afternoon, as there are no lectures. The class in Practical Anatomy last session, embraced 216 pupils, all of whom were supplied. This year, the number of pupils is 236, and they have all been supplied in the first half of the session.

Still further to increase the means of medical instruction, and to afford additional inducements for pupils to continue their studies for a longer time, the Trustees have determined to hold a Commencement for conferring Degrees in the month of July; to the end that those pupils who are admissible to examination in the preceding March, may have the opportunity of continuing four months longer, and enjoy the benefit of attending a summer course of lectures before graduating.

With the same view of promoting the cause of Medical Education, and still farther to extend the usefulness of this Institution, the Trustees have sanctioned the proposition of the Faculty, to begin the winter sessions hereafter two weeks earlier than heretofore; and in consequence of this arrangement the ensuing course of lectures will begin on the 16th day of October, by which time it is the anxious desire of the Faculty to see the whole class assembled.

In connexion with this, the Faculty would earnestly recommend that all students before leaving home, make such arrangements, that they can, without inconvenience, remain to the last lecture of the session.

It is required of candidates for the degree of Doctor of Medicine—

- 1st. That they be of lawful age and good moral character.
- 2d. That they shall have attended to a full course of lectures, the last of which at least must be in this school, and the first may be in any other fully organized and generally accredited school; but four years practice of medicine, after a regular course of study under a competent private instructor, certified to the Faculty

in a satisfactory manner, will be accepted in lieu of the latter. They must also have taken the dissecting ticket at least once.

3d. That they write an acceptable Thesis on some medical subject of their own choosing, and undergo an examination on all the branches of medicine taught in the school by the several Professors; if, when the result of the examination is tested by the votes of the Professors in Faculty assembled, there be three votes against any candidate, he may withdraw, and not be considered as rejected, or he may have a re-examination before the entire Faculty, in which case three negative votes shall reject him.

In connexion with this, the Faculty would earnestly recommend that all students before leaving home, make such arrangements, that they can, without inconvenience, remain to the last lecture of the session.

It is required of candidates for the degree of Doctor of Medicine—

1st. That they be of lawful age and good moral character.

2d. That they shall have attended two full courses of lectures, the last of which at least must be in this school, and the first may be in any other fully organized and generally accredited school; but four years practice of medicine, after a regular course of study under a competent private instructor, certified to the Faculty
